## 1908 Bandstand and 1833 Mill Tower Sun Catchers

The Heritage Commission is pleased to offer Belmont-inspired Sun Catcher ornaments, created by



**League of N.H. Craftsmen member and glass artist, Chris Salmon.** As the principal designer of Old Hancock Glass Tile, located in Antrim, New Hampshire, Salmon has designed and created commemorative items for Yellowstone National Park, the White House, Monticello, and over 50 museums and landmark sites throughout the United States.

The pressed glass commemorative is made of post-consumer, recycled glass using 600 year-old techniques Chris first learned in Germany and perfected at the Rhode Island School of Design. Featuring the historic **1908 Bandstand** and **1833 Mill**

**Tower** landmarks of Belmont village, each production is limited to 100 pieces. The special collectibles are offered in blue, light green and amber.

Presented in a keepsake bag, Belmont Village Sun Catchers are available for \$10.00 each. All funds help Heritage Commission purposes of preserving and promoting Belmont's special spaces and story, beginning with preserving our historic Bandstand.
