400 students at Huot Center

LACONIA — Classes at the J. Oliva Huot Vocational Education Center at Laconia High School opened this month with 400 students from area high schools attending the regional center, *The Citizen* reported, 25 years ago this week.

Students from Belmont, Franklin, Gilford, Inter-Lakes High School in Meredith, Winnisquam Regional High School in Tilton and from Laconia were taking part in the vocational programs, the 1987 article continued.

The center “is now entering its fifth year in the new facility and continues to offer high quality job skills training to high school juniors and seniors. “

The ten programs offered at the center “are building trades, child care, food service, health occupations, machine tool, marketing education, plumbing and heating, power mechanics, office occupations and Special Training Employment Program.”

Director was George M. Nelson II.

“Sachem’s Corner, a store operated by the vocational marketing and distributive education students, will open soon.”

Second-year building trades students “are preparing to start a home building project on Brown Hill Rd. in Belmont.”

First-year building trades students “are taking orders for small buildings such as storage sheds and bobhouses.”
