Road reconstruction leaves a mile of Route 106 as dirt surface



ON MONDAY a major road reconstruction project began on Route 106 between Laconia and Belmont. LACONIA—Major roadway reconstruction started this week on a stretch of Route 106 between Laconia and Belmont.

The road project extends from just north of the intersection with Dutile Road and Leavitt Road in Belmont to the intersection of South Main Street in Laconia.

On Wednesday, about a one mile north-south stretch of Route 106 had been removed of pavement and was a dirt surface, extending from Lakes Region Community College to the east-west intersection at Dutile and Leavitt Roads. Motorists are advised to slow down as they approach the dirt surface.

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation said the resurfacing is part of a total pavement rehabilitation project encompassing five miles of Route 106 between Laconia and Belmont. The entire road project will take several weeks with a completion date of Oct. 27 expected. Uniformed police officers and flaggers will direct motorists driving through the work zone during the daytime hours but not at night. Periodic delays can be expected between the hours of 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.

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
